

Indicators and research protocols for assessing palm oil producers, refiners and traders – March 2019

SPOTT uses a detailed framework of <u>132 indicators and research protocols to assess palm oil producers and traders</u> on the public disclosure of their policies, operations and commitments to environmental, social and governance (ESG) best practice. This ensures a fair and consistent approach to assessing all companies on SPOTT. To gain points, a company must make the required information publicly available on its website; within its annual reports, sustainability reports, presentations or other public documents; on the websites of its parent company and/or subsidiaries (if applicable), or on specific third-party platforms ("External sources").

Indicators used to score companies by supply chain segmentation are indicated as follows:
