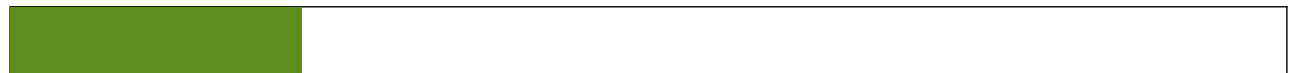

The company evaluated overall sustainability performance relating to traceability, NDPE awareness, sustainability commitment, environmental risk, and social impact, and used results to customise appropriate support and intervention strategies.

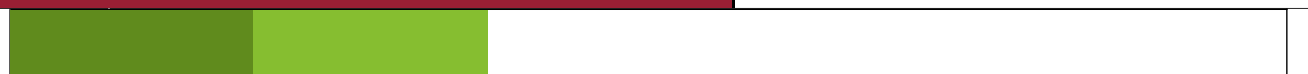
